MISSION A.M.

Romans 3:23 (NIV)

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

BRIEFING

Every soldier knows the mission requires honesty about the enemy -- and about yourself. Sin is not just a religious word. It means falling short. Missing the mark. Every one of us has done it. Admitting that is not weakness -- it is the first step toward real freedom.

OPS CHECK

- > Where have I been falling short lately -- on the court, at home, in my faith?
- > Am I being honest with God and myself about my struggles?
- > What would it look like to stop pretending and start being real?

DEPLOY

- > Pray intentionally -- confess one specific area where you have fallen short.
- > Encourage someone today who is struggling with guilt or shame.
- > Walk in honesty and humility.

HOLD THE LINE

I am not defined by my failures. I am defined by who God says I am.

AFTER ACTION P.M.

- > Where did I see God today?
 - > Did I live with honesty and humility?
 - > What can I improve tomorrow?

MISSION A.M.

Romans 6:23 (NIV)

For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

BRIEFING

In the military, actions have consequences. Disobeying orders, abandoning your post, betraying your unit -- these carry real costs. Sin carries a cost too. But here is the mission-critical truth: God did not leave us to pay that cost alone. The gift of eternal life is not earned -- it is given. That changes everything.

OPS CHECK

- > Do I truly understand the weight of what Jesus did for me?
- > Am I living like someone who has received an incredible gift -- or like someone still trying to earn it?
- > What does "eternal life" mean to me beyond just going to heaven someday?

DEPLOY

- > Pray with gratitude -- thank God specifically for the gift of eternal life.
- > Encourage someone today who feels like they have to earn God's love.
- > Walk in freedom, not guilt.

HOLD THE LINE

The price has been paid. I walk in the gift, not the debt.

AFTER ACTION P.M.

- > Where did I see God's grace today?
 - > Did I live like someone who is free?
 - > What can I improve tomorrow?

MISSION A.M.

Romans 5:8 (NIV)

But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

BRIEFING

The greatest acts of courage happen when someone runs toward danger for someone else. God did not wait for us to clean ourselves up. He did not wait for us to deserve it. While we were still in the middle of our mess -- He sent His Son. That is not just love. That is love under fire.

OPS CHECK

- > Do I believe God loves me even in my worst moments?
- > Is there someone in my life I have been waiting to love "until they get it together"?
- > How does knowing God loved me first change how I love others?

DEPLOY

- > Pray boldly -- ask God to help you love someone who is hard to love.
- > Encourage someone today who feels unworthy of love.
- > Walk in the confidence that you are fully loved.

HOLD THE LINE

God's love is not conditional. He ran toward me -- I will run toward others.

AFTER ACTION P.M.

- > Where did I experience or show unconditional love today?
 - > Did I live like someone who is fully loved?
 - > What can I improve tomorrow?

MISSION A.M.

Romans 10:9 (NIV)

If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

BRIEFING

Every soldier reaches a moment where they have to decide: Am I in or am I out? Faith is not just a feeling -- it is a decision. Declaring "Jesus is Lord" is not a casual statement. It is a commitment. It means He is in command. It means you follow His orders, even when it is hard. That decision changes your entire mission.

OPS CHECK

- > Have I truly made the decision to follow Jesus -- or am I still on the fence?
- > What does it mean in my daily life for Jesus to be "Lord"?
- > Is there an area of my life where I have not surrendered command to Him?

DEPLOY

- > Pray with commitment -- tell God you are all in.
- > Encourage someone today who is wrestling with the decision to follow Jesus.
- > Walk in full surrender.

HOLD THE LINE

Jesus is Lord. I am all in. No turning back.

AFTER ACTION P.M.

- > Where did I live out my commitment to Jesus today?
 - > Did I walk in full surrender?
 - > What can I improve tomorrow?

MISSION A.M.

Romans 10:13 (NIV)

Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

BRIEFING

In combat, calling for backup is not weakness -- it is wisdom. The soldier who refuses to call for support when they need it is not brave; they are a liability. God has made it simple: call on His name. Not because you have earned the right. Not because you have it all together. Just call. He answers.

OPS CHECK

- > Am I calling on God regularly -- or only in emergencies?
- > Is there something I have been trying to handle on my own that I need to bring to God?
- > Do I believe God actually hears me when I pray?

DEPLOY

- > Pray specifically -- bring one thing you have been carrying alone to God today.
- > Encourage someone today to call on God instead of going it alone.
- > Walk in dependence, not self-sufficiency.

HOLD THE LINE

I will call on His name. He hears me. He answers.

AFTER ACTION P.M.

- > Where did I lean on God instead of myself today?
 - > Did I walk in dependence and trust?
 - > What can I improve tomorrow?

MISSION A.M.

Romans 8:1 (NIV)

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

BRIEFING

After a hard deployment, soldiers come home changed. Some carry wounds. Some carry guilt. Some replay every decision they made. But in Christ, there is a word that cuts through all of it: no condemnation. Not "less condemnation." Not "condemnation if you mess up again." None. Zero. The mission has been completed by Jesus -- and you walk free.

OPS CHECK

- > Is there guilt or shame I am still carrying that Jesus has already paid for?
- > What would my life look like if I truly believed there is no condemnation for me?
- > How can I help someone else walk in freedom today?

DEPLOY

- > Pray with freedom -- release the guilt you have been holding onto.
- > Encourage someone today who is living under condemnation.
- > Walk in the freedom Christ has given you.

HOLD THE LINE

There is no condemnation for me. I am free. I walk in that freedom today.

AFTER ACTION P.M.

- > Where did I experience freedom from guilt or shame today?
 - > Did I walk like someone who is truly free?
 - > What can I improve tomorrow?

MISSION A.M.

Romans 8:37 (NIV)

In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

BRIEFING

The mission is not just to survive -- it is to overcome. Not in your own strength. Not through sheer willpower. But through Him who loved us. "More than conquerors" means you do not just barely make it through. You come out on the other side stronger, deeper, more alive. That is the promise. That is the mission. Shut Up the Lies! Serve God! Serve Others.

OPS CHECK

- > What battle am I facing right now that I need to trust God to conquer through me?
- > Am I living like a conqueror -- or like someone just trying to survive?
- > How has God already shown Himself faithful in past battles?

DEPLOY

- > Pray with boldness -- declare victory over one specific area of your life.
- > Encourage someone today who is in the middle of a hard battle.
- > Walk like more than a conqueror.

HOLD THE LINE

I am more than a conqueror through Christ who loves me. The battle is already won.

AFTER ACTION P.M.

- > Where did I see God's victory in my life today?
 - > Did I walk like more than a conqueror?
 - > What will I carry forward from this 7-day devotional?
